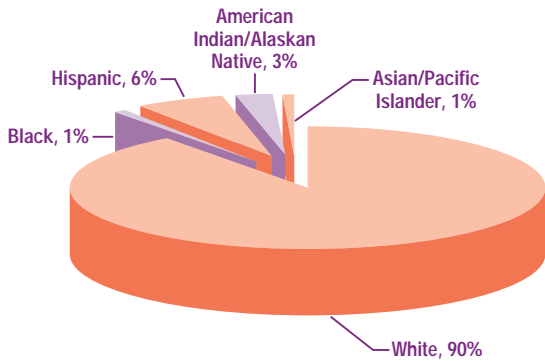

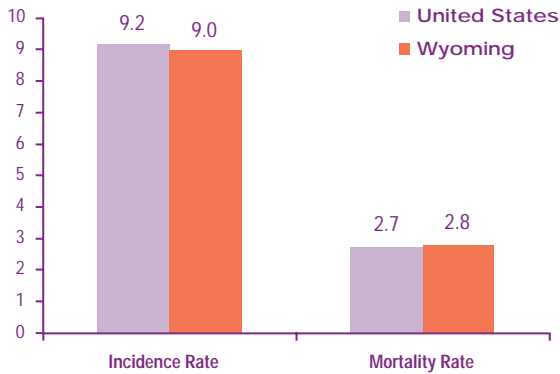
Demographics

Incidence and Mortality



- The incidence rate of cervical cancer in Wyoming, 9.0/100,000, is lower than the national average of 9.2/100,000.
- The mortality rate of cervical cancer in Wyoming, 2.8/100,000, is higher than the national average of 2.7/100,000.

Scoring total: 5 out of 16 points (31%)

- Incidence rates of cervical cancer by race are not available for Wyoming.

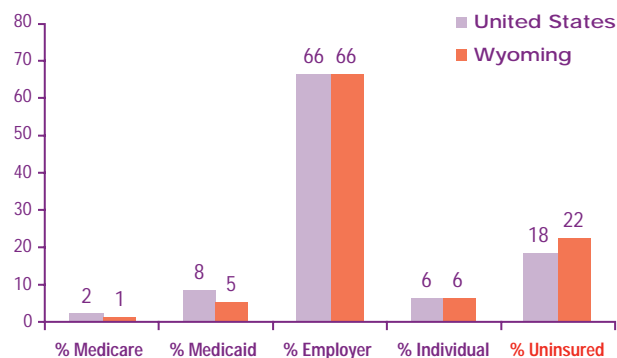
Mortality Rates by Race

- Mortality rates of cervical cancer by race are not available for Wyoming.

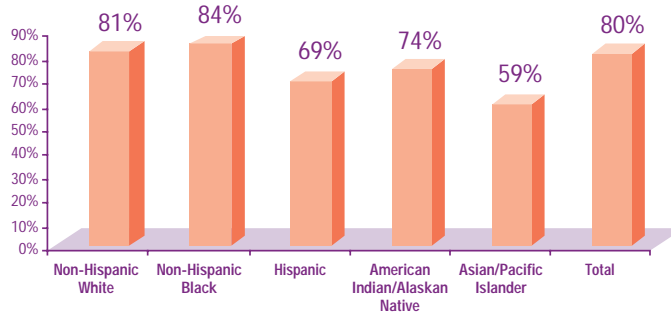
Healthcare Access & Utilization

- 80% of women reported being screened for cervical cancer in the past 3 years.
- Wyoming Medicaid offers coverage of HPV testing without restriction.
- Wyoming does not mandate that health insurers allow women access to OB/GYNs without a referral from their primary care provider (PCP), nor do they mandate that insurers allow OB/GYNs to be designated as a woman's PCP.

Policy Initiatives & Infrastructure

- **Coverage mandates for cervical cancer screening**
 - Wyoming does have legislation in place mandating cervical cancer screening coverage for Pap testing.
- **Task force/commissions for cervical cancer prevention**
 - Wyoming does not have legislation in place for a Cervical Cancer Elimination Task Force.
- **Miscellaneous support of cervical cancer prevention**
 - Wyoming does not have any other legislation in place for cervical cancer prevention.

Data Collection and Tracking

- Wyoming maintains high quality cancer data and is one of the leading states at using cancer tracking data for prevention efforts.

Statewide Prevention Programs

- **National Breast and Cervical Cancer Early Detection Program:** More than 3,000 women have received Pap testing, and more than 4,000 pap tests have been performed since 1997. To date, the program has diagnosed 72 cases of cervical cancer.

Women's Health Source: Funded by the Wyoming Breast and Cervical Cancer Early Detection Program, the goal of the program is to enroll and provide early detection services to Wyoming women aged 18 and older that are most at-risk for developing cervical cancer. Women must meet certain income and other criteria to qualify. A Medical Advisory Committee oversees the program which has been 100% federally funded since 1996. The purpose of the network is to coordinate efforts, disseminate information and materials, and coordinate outreach to Wyoming communities.
