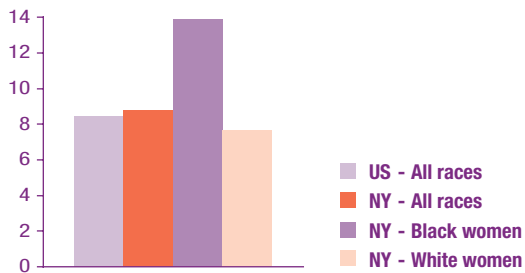

## Incidence and Mortality

- The incidence rate was 8.8/100,000 for a score of 1.
- This is higher than the national average of 8.4/100,000.
- *The incidence rate in last year's report was 9.1/100,000 for a score of 1.*
- The mortality rate was 2.7/100,000 for a score of 1.
- This is higher than the national average of 2.5/100,000.
- *The mortality rate in last year's report was 2.6/100,000 for a score of 1.*
- Incidence and mortality rates were higher among black women than among white women.

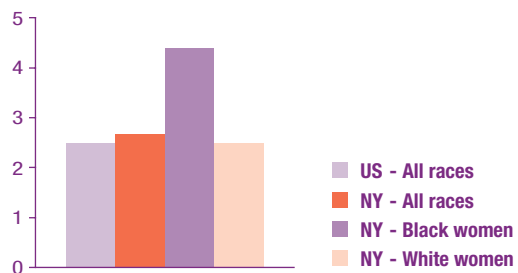
### Cervical Cancer Incidence

US and NY (# of deaths per 100,000 women)

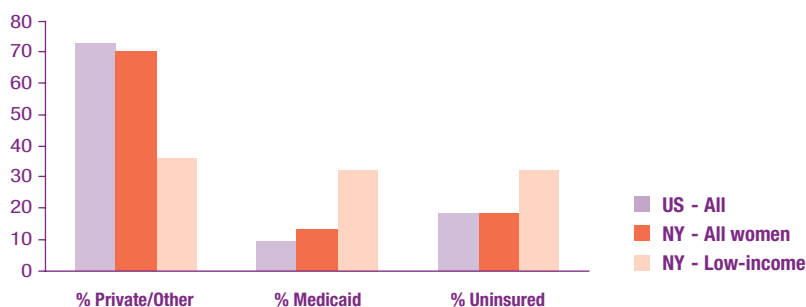


## Healthcare Access and Utilization

- The cervical cancer screening rate was 85.4% for a score of 1.
- This is lower than the national average of 85.9%.
- *The screening rate in last year's report was 84.5% for a score of 1.*
- In this state, Medicaid offers unrestricted coverage of HPV testing, for a score of 2.
- In this state, 18% of women are uninsured for a score of 1.
- This is the same as the national average of 18%.
- *The rate of uninsured in last year's report was 18% for a score of 1.*

## Policy Initiatives and Infrastructure

- **Coverage mandates for cervical cancer screening**
  - SB 5499, introduced May 27, 2005, extends medical assistance to persons with breast and cervical cancer; provides that resources available to eligible individuals shall not be considered nor required to be applied toward the payment of the cost of medical care; provides that an individual is eligible for presumptive eligibility in accordance with managed care program provisions. Cumulative score of 1.
- **Task force/commissions for cervical cancer prevention**
  - AB 2343, January 25, 2005, establishes a sixteen member task force on cervical cancer prevention, detection, and education and provides for its membership, functions, powers, and duties; requires an annual report to the Governor, Legislature, Legislative Women’s Caucus, and the State Director of Women in Government in New York State.
  - SB 1560, introduced January 31, 2005, establishes a task force on, cervical cancer prevention, detection, and education and provides for its membership, functions, powers, and duties.
  - Cumulative score of 2.
- **Miscellaneous support of cervical cancer prevention**
  - AB 6955, introduced April 1, 2005, relates to directing the granting of four hours of excused leave to public officers and employees of this state to undertake screening for cervical cancer. Cumulative score of 2.
