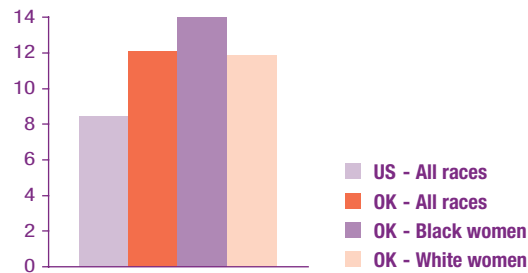
State population estimate: 3,523,553

Incidence and Mortality

- The incidence rate was 12.1/100,000 for a score of 0.
- This is higher than the national average of 8.4/100,000.
- *The incidence rate in last year's report was 9.6/100,000 for a score of 1.*
- The mortality rate was 3.0/100,000 for a score of 1.
- This is higher than the national average of 2.5/100,000.
- *The mortality rate in last year's report was 3.0/100,000 for a score of 1.*
- Incidence rates were higher among black women than among white women; mortality rates were not available by race.

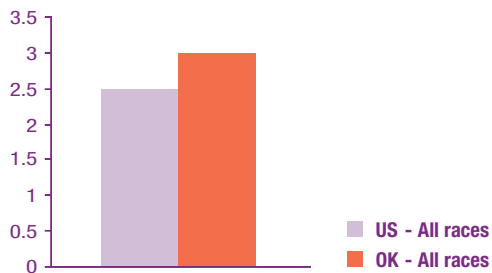
Cervical Cancer Incidence

US and OK (# of deaths per 100,000 women)

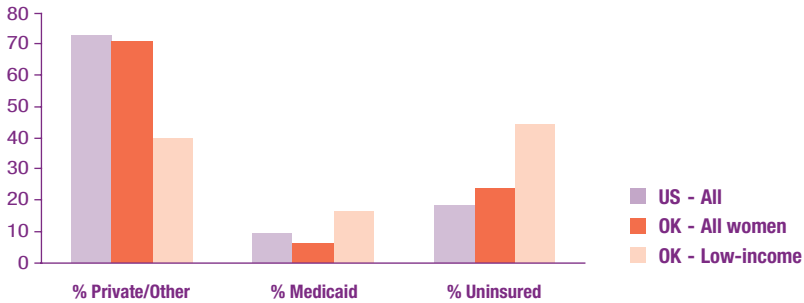


Healthcare Access and Utilization

- The cervical cancer screening rate was 82.9% for a score of 1.
- This is lower than the national average of 85.9%.
- *The screening rate in last year's report was 80.9% for a score of 0.*
- In this state, Medicaid offers unrestricted coverage of HPV testing, for a score of 2.
- In this state, 24% of women are uninsured for a score of 0.
- This is higher than the national average of 18%.
- *The rate of uninsured in last year's report was 22% for a score of 0.*

Policy Initiatives and Infrastructure

- **Coverage mandates for cervical cancer screening**
 - There are no coverage or screening mandates for a cumulative score of 0.
- **Task force/commissions for cervical cancer prevention**
 - HB 1906, introduced January 21, 2005, relates to the Oklahoma Breast and Cervical Cancer Prevention and Treatment Advisory Committee; modifies purposes; provides an effective date. Cumulative score of 2.
- **Miscellaneous support of cervical cancer prevention**
 - SB 825, introduced January 21, 2005, relates to public health and safety and revenue and taxation; relates to the Belle Maxine Hilliard Breast and Cervical Cancer Treatment Revolving Fund; modifies name of fund; clarifies references; provides an effective date; declares an emergency. Cumulative score of 2.
