<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • HB 2230 & SB 779 would require the Department of Health to provide the parents/guardian of female students entering the 6th grade with information on the connection between HPV and cervical cancer and the availability of the HPV vaccine; parents would be asked to voluntarily provide the school with written statement stating that the student has received the vaccine or the parent has decided not to have the student immunized; school departments would submit a report to the state detailing the number of students who have received the vaccine; HB 2230 died in committee; SB 779 passed the Senate and had a third reading in the House before the session ended. • HB 2272/SB 1215 would require sexuality education courses to provide information about the HPV vaccine; died in committee. 			1	2
